


Upcoming Events

fiction "Formation" (originally published in NOON 2016 and later in The Pushcart Prize XXXI: Best of the Small Presses, 2007) was reprinted in <u>FLASHFICTION.NET</u>; a review of her book *Snowdog* (Ravenna Press, 2021) was recently published in <u>Tupelo Quarterly</u>.

"Two Cape Cod Poems" by LISA BERGLUND have appeared in New World Writing.

The Poets and Writers Series launched by DAVID LAMPE in 1974 is the subject of a feature story on the Buffalo State website, part of the commemoration of the college's 150th anniversary.
